



Sexual Violence & Protection

TITLE IX - The federal law prohibiting sex discrimination in educational institutions.

- <u>Sexual Assault</u> An attempt, coupled with the ability, to commit a violent injury on the person of another because of that person's gender or sex.
- <u>Dating and Domestic Violence</u> Violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim and where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors: the length of the relationship, the type of relationship, and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship.
- <u>Stalking</u> Engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety, or the safety of others, or to suffer substantial emotional distress.



Monterey Peninsula College Promise

To Be Eligible, Student Must..

- Complete the FAFSA or California Dream Act Application
- Be a graduate of a of a California high school or adult school
- Be a first-time college student
- Enroll full-time (12 units or more)
- Select an educational goal to earn a certificate, associate's degree, or transfer to a four-year university.
- Complete an MPC Orientation session and develop an Educational Plan.

College Key Terms



<u>Prerequisite</u> - A requirement you must meet before enrolling in a course.

Co-requisite - A course that must be taken with another course.

Recommendation/ Advisory - A recommended level of coursework, but not a requirement before enrollment into a class.

<u>Grade Points</u> - Letter grades A, B, C, D, F are used to calculate your GPA. Grades that are Credit/No Credit, Incomplete, In Progress, Military Withdrawal, Withdrawal, and Report Delayed are not included in GPA.

<u>Withdrawal</u> - Process of officially dropping a class, a "W" may be assigned for each withdrawal from a course.



College Key Terms





<u>Transcript</u> - Copy of student's academic record including units attempted, completed, GPA, grades during attendance at MPC.

Education Plan - An outline of the coursework required to complete your **educational** goal or program of study.

- Abbreviated Ed Plan A 1-2 semester plan
- <u>Comprehensive Ed Plan</u> Complete outline of all classes that will be taken to complete major of study, adding up to 60 units or more.

Certificates

Certificate of Completion



- Basic skills level coursework
- Workforce preparation programs leading to improved employability and/or job opportunities
- Currently only available in English as a Second Language

Certificate of Training

- Fast Track
- Involves 1-2 intensive semesters
- Prepares for entry level positions
- Requires 10-25 hours of commitment depending on your field
- Examples: Automotive Technology & Office Technology (Entry Level Office Work)



Certificate of Achievement



- Occupational & Academic Programs
- Classes prepare you for an occupation
- 18-38 units to complete
- Typically takes 2-4 semesters to complete
- Examples: Dental Assisting, Business Accounting



Associate Degree

- Must take General Education
 Requirements, classes in major, and elective courses.
- Total of 60 units and have at least a GPA of 2.0

Graduation Requirements for the Associate Degree



- Complete courses in Reading, Writing = English 1A, Mathematics =
 Intermediate Algebra, and Information Competency Lib. 50 with a "C" or better
- Major: Complete all major classes with a "C" average
- General Education must be completed
- Students must have a minimum total of 60 units and have at least a GPA of 2.0
- Residence: Complete twelve units at MPC (6 units in major area)



Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)



A TAG is a "contract" that universities make with students who meet the transfer admission requirements and will therefore receive early notification of Conditional acceptance. These agreements have GPA minimums and unit completion requirements.



Guaranteed Transfer Programs

Monterey Peninsula College provides students with Guaranteed Transfer programs for those who qualify to all California State University (CSU) and most University of California (UC) campuses plus a growing number of private and out-of-state universities.

Priority Registration



To be eligible for priority registration, you must have determined your placement recommendations, completed the orientation, and have a current education plan.

- Students may register 24 hours per day, beginning at 8AM on their priority registration day. We encourage all students to check their WebReg portal for their Registration Priority.
- Priority registration is based on program affiliation or on the number of units completed and/or in progress at Monterey Peninsula College.



Tips for Success

- Get organized prior to first day of class
 - Binder & Notebooks
 - Planner
 - Check your email and student portal.
- Study the campus map and learn where your classes are located prior to first day
- Set aside 2 hours of study per unit
- Make time to meet with instructors during their office hours
